

"I wasn't expecting this level of support with a phonics program."

We spoke to Learning Specialist, April Shores-Endrigat, at Le Jardin Academy in Hawaii about *Read Write Inc.* Phonics in an International Baccalaureate school.

Regardless of your approach to education, a solid foundation in reading is necessary for all future learning. We are an International Baccalaureate (IB) school and our lessons are 'inquiry-based,' meaning no pre-cut lesson plans – we let the children take a more leading role in their education.

While we knew we were putting out amazing thinkers into the world, we realized we needed a different approach to teaching reading and writing. We needed a formal approach that was more sequential and structured. It was at this point that we started searching for a phonics program.

I looked into different phonics programs but none were quite right for our needs until I came across *Read Write Inc.* Phonics. I was at an IB conference in Hong Kong and met many other teachers who were struggling to mesh the inquiry-based system with an effective system of teaching reading and writing.
