mnemonic phrases have helped him form the letters correctly too.

He can now read CVC words using the assisted blending approach - moving his finger along the letters to read. He also uses magnetic letters to spell out simple English words independently.

Jerónimo is ready to start reading the ditty books and is very excited!

What would you say to other schools considering adopting *Read Write Inc.* Phonics?
